WORSHOP Dental Panoramic Imaging, Faculty of Dentistry, 22 February 2019

Approval by the Medical Radiation Protection Division, Ministry of Health Malaysia has placed the Faculty of Dentistry, MAHSA University as an accredited and recognized center for the training of dental surgeons on panoramic imaging. Under the Atomic Energy Licensing Act (Act 304), it is mandatory for all dental surgeons wishing to own dental panoramic machines in their clinics to undergo this course.

This workshop was successfully conducted by Prof Dr Prabhakaran Nambiar, Dr JS Manzoor, Dr Prashanti Chippagiri and assisted by radiographers Ms Khairunisa Izzati and Ms Faezah Idris.

Participants gained knowledge as well as had a field day learning how to take good panoramic images.

ORAL WELLNESS MONTH



To start the New Year and in conjunction with the Health and Wellness theme - Faculty of Dentistry is enthusiastic to keep their students on their toes even at lunch time – an observance designed to promote healthy lifestyles.

This month dental students are reminding MAHSA citizens about good oral health habits and encouraging them to make regular dental checkups a part of their own wellness routine via free dental check-ups.

Year 4 and year 5 students were put on rotation to provide free oral examinations to any MAHSA citizen who visits our mobile booth at the SPINE. Come lunch time, you will see 4 students pushing blue screens, portable chairs and lights to the SPINE to organize the temporary booth daily for 1 month. Minimal equipment used as visual examinations was performed to determine the oral status. Oral hygiene instruction was provided and a more comprehensive examination and treatment if required, the "visitors" were advised to drop in at MAHSA Dental Clinic.

A total of 186 MAHSA citizens visited our booth – which is roughly an average of 10 – 12 visitors per session - quite encouraging for a start. The Faculty hopes to get a better response in future and thanks to Prof Dr. Kiran for mooting this great idea and to Lt. Col. Dr. SD. Govind for his untiring assistance in planning the booth.


